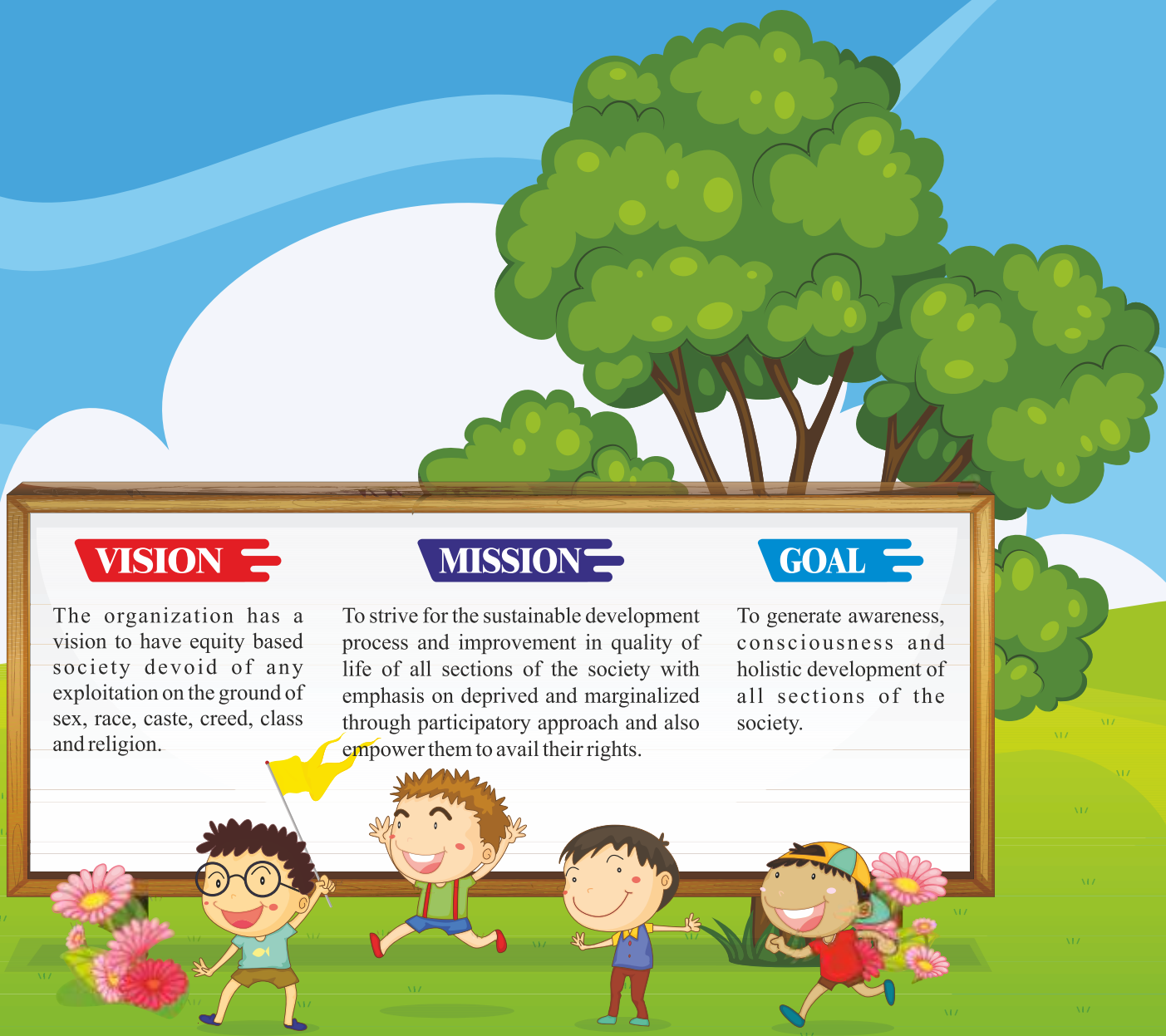

Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP) is a secular, non-political and nonprofit voluntary organization established by a group of committed individuals in the leadership of Late Sri Devendra Prasad Singh in 1983. The group was inspired by the philosophies of the great freedom fighters and got influenced for voluntary actions, after the movement of Jai Prakash Narayan for total revolution.

The founders of BJUP belonged from rural areas, so they were fully aware about the issues of marginalized, deprived and underprivileged communities of the area and also had good rapport with villages as a whole. They quickly realized that the socio-economic problems of these areas were so acute and intense and these problems could not be dealt in a shorter period of time without joint efforts for longer period. To address the history of neglects and exploitation of the area, they started a collective. Thus, they initiated BJUP, as an informal platform in year 1983 and when the intensity of interventions and stakeholders engagement increased, they formally registered BJUP under the Society Registration Act in 1986.

Since its inception the Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP) is operating and strategizing its approaches and activities with the following Vision, Mission and Goal:-

The organization has a vision to have equity based society devoid of any exploitation on the ground of sex, race, caste, creed, class and religion.

To strive for the sustainable development process and improvement in quality of life of all sections of the society with emphasis on deprived and marginalized through participatory approach and also empower them to avail their rights.

To generate awareness, consciousness and holistic development of all sections of the society.

The range of intervention is education, access to safe health and nutrition, alternative to livelihood and access to government scheme. We strongly realize the importance of Panchayati Raj Institution and hence continuously negotiating with them in almost all programme intervention. We strive to make this growth pattern sustainable in the time frame. We will look forward to have strong relation with our existing partners and meaningful ties with our donors.

Organizational Profile

BJUP's Programmatic Experience: -

BJUP started its different interventions from Nalanda district in Bihar and in the course of time expanded its interventions to other parts of Bihar State and Jharkhand. Since inception, BJUP has been working with the marginalized and underprivileged sections of society like Dalit, Minorities, Women, Children, Adolescents & Youth, Old Age, Farmers and laborers.

The organization works with special focus on Holistic Child Rights, Children Deprived of Education, Mother & Child Health, Children inflicted with neglect and violence, Children facing other vulnerabilities. BJUP has also extensive experience in addressing issues like HIV AIDS & Tuberculosis. BJUP believes in development with justice and want children to bloom in their full potential and personalities. With this commitment the organization has sustainably carried on its thematic thrust on addressing all kinds of vulnerabilities faced by children and adults. Thus school Drop Out, quality education and Child Labour Issues became one of the central themes for operation of the organization.

Present Status: -

Today, BJUP is one of most streamlined organizations involved in the empowerment of the rural and marginalized communities through mutual learning, participatory action and advocacy. BJUP has developed key insights regarding the range of issues associated with the lives of rural and marginalized communities. These insights have enabled the organization to develop effective strategies for addressing the challenges associated with dalits and marginalized community development. BJUP has developed various successful models of community participation which have been widely appreciated by organizations, institutions, experts and professionals involved in the sector across the country.

Strength of Organization: -

In the course of developmental journey BJUP has partnered with various national and international agencies both governmental and non-governmental and has emerged as a lead agency in the sphere of Civil Society Coalitions, Civil Society Networking and in Partnership Mode of Project Implementation and also as a Nodal Agency for the Consortium. The institution has taken lead role in the implementation of state wide programmes, where BJUP had to take prominent roles in Grant Management, Giving Programme Direction & Inputting Internal as well as External Teams, Handholding of supported Partners, Coalition Team Work, Expansion of the Programmes, Perspective Building of Project Teams, Scaling up of the Projects and also Extensive Project Monitoring & Management. BJUP has developed key expertise regarding various areas of development which includes, Child Rights & Protection, Health & WASH, Education, Holistic Village Development, Women Empowerment, Livelihood & Skill Development, Old Age Care and other burning issues of the operational areas.

In all these operations the organization has always kept the Mahadalit and the other Dalit and Minority



Communities at the center of its focus.

BJUP has enabled an extensive networking with other like-minded organizations and Govt. organizations/ Departments. These networks have played important role in influencing and strengthening our programs.

With the years of direct work experience at grassroot level and ensuring entitlement issues for the community, we have been also trying our level best to develop a co-operational system of networking with different organizations and to a great extent we also have succeeded in our effort. We believe and have experienced that networking and collaborative institutional team building is the most successful strategies for expanding the impact at a larger scale and reach. BJUP has been instrumental in the organic emergence of some of these listed networks and in others BJUP has played vital roles in institutional growth and thematic directions. Along with programmatic interventions BJUP also had vital roles to play with respect to fund raising, fund flow and fund management of some of these networks.

Background of the project :

This project entitled 'BACHPAN - *Building Atmosphere for Child's Holistic development Protection & Nurturing*' It is being run and implemented in the slum areas of Bihar Sharif, Nalanda District, Bihar. This project aims to protect and nurture the children in need of care & protection after their separation from families. The Project intervention areas are Slums viz. Baridargah, Alinagar, Jhingnagar, Sorabi Par, Mirganj, Paharpura & Katranadi of Bihar Sharif.

Objectives :

"Psycho-Social and Physical development of children in need of care & protection for making them responsible and independent citizens of the country".

The above statement explains goal of the project i.e. we intend to help the child in need of care and protection to get an enabling family environment, so that in a long term it would facilitate their development in all aspects i.e, psychologically, socially and physically. It further enables them to become responsible citizens of the country and also to lead their life independently.

Achievement during the year 2018-19 :

- 30 children with their siblings got proper care and protection.
- 84 monthly Child club meeting organized, 1075 participants attended the meetings.
- 84 monthly Slum committee meeting organised 1086 participant attended.
- 4 quarterly Child Club protection committee meeting were organized and 103 participants attended it.
- Awareness generation through IEC activities and street plays to educate them on government schemes and protection of children.
- Special day - Children's Day, Independence Day, Republic Day were celebrated.
- Distribution of Sanitary Napkin to school and organized session on the menstrual hygiene among school adolescent girls.
- Health camps were Organized and medicine distributed.
- An interface meeting with CWC members, families and other stakeholders was organized.
- Parental skill training was imparted in 7 slums.
- Two Capacity Building of Community Child protection on Committee (CCPC) & Slum Committee on alternate form of care and protection was organized.





Community Empowerment Project

Project Background :

The BJUP is implementing of the Community Empowerment Project, which has been started with the Support of Responsible Mica Initiative (RMI), France in collaboration with Association for Stimulating Know How, Gurugram. This project aims to improve the livelihood conditions of the informal mica collectors by increasing their income level (individual and group collectors) and enhancing the education of the children (particularly child labourers involved in family based mica collection) and the maternal and child health conditions in 40 villages in Jharkhand State (Koderma and Giridih districts) and Bihar State (Nawada district). The BJUP is directly intervening in 10 villages in Rajauli block of Nawada district of Bihar. The project has 4 main components and expected outcomes, which are as follows :

- **Livelihood** : 1800 mica collectors will have increased income through agriculture, livestock, other additional/ alternative livelihood opportunities and mica collection activities.
- **Access to Quality Education** : Explore the options for education of vulnerable children and ensure 100% children of the 40 villages accessing quality education.
- **Nutrition and health of Children and Women** : Children and women from the targeted 40 villages will have improved nutrition and Health conditions.
- **Access to social entitlements and strengthening of local institutions** : Mica collector families have increased access to govt. schemes through strengthened Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI). Mobilizing the government scheme for the welfare of the concerned families.

Major Achievement during the year 2018-19 :

- Conducted HH Survey of 747 HH in 10 targeted villages.
- Completed Livelihood mapping Survey of 707 HH in all 10 villages.
- 60 Community meetings were organized on different issues - Improving Livelihood programme, Health and Nutrition, Right and entitlement and education in all 10 villages.
- Organized 32 Meetings with AWWs, School teachers, ASHA and PRI Members.
- 4 Meetings were held with B.D.O and Labour department Team – on the issues of child labor and their status.



Success Story

Mr. Sandeep Rajwansi hails from Newsingar village of Hardiya Panchayat of Rajauli Block and he belongs to Mushar community, the mahadalit. He does not have any land, so there is no farm income to support him. His main occupation is collection of Mica and his wife opened a small general store at her house. Sandeep has five members in his family along with 3 children. His 3 sons do not attend school. All members of the family – including the kids – are engaged either in MICA collection or support in family shop.

After implementation of project, RMI team visited the Newsingar. During our meeting with the community, we got the information about Mr Sandeep Rajwansi. Team visited his home and met with Sandeep & his wife. We emphasized on the importance of education for the children. Since none of the kids were going to school, we keep our negotiation with the family regularly and tried to motivate them for sending their children to school. Finally both Mr Sandeep and his wife agreed for sending the kids to the school. Team visited the school, met with the principal and requested for kid's enrollment. RMI project team also negotiated with the school for proper monitoring and attention on these children.



Targeted Intervention

Project Background :

The Bihar State AIDS Control Society supports the initiative of Targeted Intervention of BJUP. This project is being implemented in four blocks of Nalanda District of Bihar. The HRG who are in the age group of 18-45 years, are eligible to register under this project. Presently total 723 HRG are getting services from this program out of which 617 are FSW and 106 are MSM.

Targeted interventions are aimed at offering prevention and care services to high risk populations (Female Sex Workers- FSW, Male having Sex with Male- MSM and Injecting Drug Users- IDUs) within communities by providing them with the information, means and skills they need to minimize HIV transmission and improving their access to care, support and treatment services.

This project envisages that engaging Community Based Organization (CBOs) in programme management through developing their capacity and ownership leading to steering of community agenda through themselves only. Presently the TIs have been able to provide services through peers representing the community

Objectives of the Project :

- To provide effective and innovative BCC to HRG and facilitate to create health seeking environment among the community.
- To increase the STI / HIV AIDS awareness, knowledge score from 80% -90%.
- To provide STI treatment to the vulnerable HRG to reduce the incidence of STI.
- To educate and aware the targeted groups on consistent and correct use of condom.
- To establish model drop in facilities for FSW & MSM.
- To generate awareness on using condoms for protection from STI and related disease.

Activities detail :

- 2924 High risk group and community people have been helped through regular counselling.
- We identified 11 STI cases, got it diagnose and provided treatment.
- 2558 High risk group people helped through regular medical Checkup.
- 1332 FSW and MSM were tested for HIV.
- 43058 free Condom were distributed to the vulnerable groups
- 1332 FSW and MSM were tested for Syphilis
- 3 new FSW were registered in this year.
- 12 Need based support provided to the HRG to reintegrate their family.
- 12 staff meetings were organized.

Celebrated World Aids Day (1st of December) at Rajgir and shared the preventive measure to the community on protection from HIV Infection



Vihaan Project

Background :

The Vihaan project, a national initiative on the issue of Care and Support to HIV/AIDS positive people, is getting implemented by BJUP with the support of NCPI+. This project has three important components like (1) Intensifying and Consolidating Prevention services with a focus on HRG and vulnerable populations (2) Expanding IEC services for general population and high risk groups with a focus on behavior change and demand generation (3) Comprehensive Care, Support and Treatment

Vihaan Project is establishing and managing 350 Care & Support Centres (CSCs) across India to expand access to essential services, increase treatment adherence, reduce stigma, discrimination and improved quality of life for people living with HIV (PLHIV). Vihaan CSCs are committed to the health and wellbeing of PLHIV and their families. We are putting special effort to reach to underserved populations - women, children and members of high-risk groups, FSW, MSM, transgender, eunuch and people who inject drugs (PWID).

Under Vihaan Project BJUP provides access to a range of quality care & support services using an integrated approach that complements existing HIV prevention and treatment programming. Working in coordination with nearby ART Centre, CSCs serve as safe spaces for PLHIV offering services that include counseling, outreach and follow-up support, health referrals, and linkages to social welfare schemes.



Objectives :

In order to reach the long term goal of improving the standard of life, reducing stigma and discrimination from the life of PLHIV, we have the following objectives:

- Improve health and hygiene practices among PLHIV.
- Early linkage of PLHIV with care & support centre and treatment services.
- Improve nutritional status of PLHIV.
- Promote social protection and wellbeing of PLHIV.
- Improve enabling PLHIV friendly environment.
- Strengthen community system to reduce the stigma and discrimination.

Achievement during the year 2018-19 :

- 1367 new registration.
- 1245 patients were active in CSC.
- Counselling services to 1367 Patients
- Follow up visit - 1820
- Four advocacy meetings were organized.
- Home visit to 585 target group members
- Referral service to 604 patients

- 9 Coordination meetings with ART
- Linkages developed with government schemes and services

Pahal (Women Leading Change)

Background of the project :

The Pahal, Women Leading Change, is being implemented by BJUP with the support of Center for Catalyzing Change, New Delhi. This project is getting implemented at HISUA & SIRDLA Block of NAWADA District. The aim of this Project is to have an interactive discussion by engaging with the Elected Panchayat members' viz., Mukhiya, Up Mukhiya, Ward Members including Block Medical Official, Block Health Manager and Block Center Manager could discuss the Health Status of the Women. It is also to assess the condition & current situation of state government's health programme being provided at different Anganwadi Center & also at Health Sub Center. The participants explored several options based on the findings, deciding on these options and decide the way forward for improvement. Participants explored several options, strategies, new procedures for operation and management. They also recommended the ways of improvements in the conditions of mother & Children in the family. Improvement in status of Mother and Child is critical for holistic development. BJUP started working at 10 Panchayat of Hisua Block & 15 Panchayat of Sirdla Block. We get details from 25 Panchayat of 261 elected Panchayati Raj representatives; out of these 183 women 51 are Men ward members. They are the also members of Village Health, Sanitation & Nutrition Committee.

Objectives:

- Sensitize the Elected representatives in improving Women Health issues.
- Sensitize the Government official on the services currently being provided at Health Sub Center, Anganwari & Primary Health Center for the maternal Health.
- Prepare the data base of Health Facilities in the area and share with the respective Panchayat.
- Popularize the concept of maternal health care among community to fulfill the demands of women.
- Awareness generation on the use of Toll-free number – 104 and seeing the medical service.
- To share the details about Medical Grievance Redressal & Advise System" and "Lok Jan Shikayat Adhiniyam.

Major Works during the year 2018-19 :

- 4 Round Cluster level meeting on Maternal Health, Family Planning and Reproductive health.
- 6 Public Health family welfare and village health sanitation committee meetings. 72 participants attended this meeting..
- 2 Dialogue Meeting with PHFW&VSC members. Shared the details of current status of Medical services being provided at Panchayat.
- Organized 2 block level interface meeting with BDO, MOIC of Hisua and Sirdla to share the details of medical issue.
- Organized 6 Bi monthly meeting at Panchayat level of Hisua and Sirdla.
- Filled twice the Health Checklist to assess the status of Health services delivered by government at Anganwari Centre, Sub Centre, PHC of Hisua & Sirdla.



Success Story :

Mrs Kunti Devi is ward member of Manjhgawa panchayat. She belongs to OBC category. She has 2 Children. After associated with Panel Project, she took part in VHSND and visited the Anganwadi. During filling the health checklist, she came to conclusion that Anganwadi centre is run in rented building and its condition is not good. During rainy season water flush in into the room. She discussed this with others community member and plan to meet with CDPO either to construct the government building or change the centre in other building. CDPO told that the construction of new building would take more than 6 month. She suggested searching a new rented on same amount of rent. She promised, when the new rented place was found, She would approve the shifting of the centre. Ward member identified a new better place and got approval from CDPO for shifting the existing Anganwadi into in the new premise. Now the Anganwadi Centre is functioning well in new premise. This effort of Kunti Devi was appreciated by all villagers.



Devendra Industrial Training Centre (DITC)

Background :

This industrial training centre is running with the affiliation from NCVT, New Delhi. This is very effective institute for youths. After completing their course / training youths are getting engaged in employment generation activities or in livelihood promotion activities. Devendar ITI got recognition from NCVT, New Delhi in the year of 2010 and its session started from July 2011. It is very pertinent to mention here that it is named after the founder General Secretary Late Mr. Devendra Prashad Singh, who sacrificed his life for the social cause. One of his main aims was to generate employment opportunities for the rural youths. To realize his noble dream and aim, this ITI was established in Goshrawan village of Giriyak Block. It provides training to the youths to become electrician and fitter. Since its inception, many youth especially Mahadalits are benefited from the effective and good training curriculum of the institute. This is very renowned institute of Bihar. The needy youths are provided with support of free accommodation and also scholarship. Apart from the courses on industrial training, we also impart free of charge computer education to the enrolled youths in the institute. In this financial year 55 students were enrolled in the institute. Majority of students belong to SC and OBC communities. After successfully completing, their training majority of youths got jobs in various government as well as private firms. The Center has overall 32 staffs out of which 15 are Trade specific skilled trainers and 17 are support staffs for efficiently managing the institute.

Achievement :

- Enrolled students in ITI = 55
- Electrician=42
- Fitter=13
- Students enrolled in Computer science=55





Children Home

Background of the project :

BJUP with the support of State Child Protection Society, Social & welfare Department Govt. of Bihar, started a children Home at Nalanda District. It caters the need of 50 Children. As per the provisions of JJ Act, separate home is provided for the children in need of care and protection. It is named as - Children Home. Here children are protected from abuse, sexual exploitation, working as child or bonded labourer and drug abuse. During their stay in the children Home, essential services viz food, cloths, health care, education facility, recreation and other opportunities are being provided .The main reason to established this home is to creating enabling family environment for children required for holistic development. The children are supported in restoring their dignity and self-worthiness by repatriating them in their respective family under the activity rehabilitation and family reunification.

Since this center functions for the protection of children and they are provided in-house support for educational classes, library, and facilities for both indoor and outdoor games. The children are also taken on excursion trip. We enroll the interested children in government mainstream schools.

Achievement during the year 2018-19 :

- 148 children were referred to our Children Home.
- 116 Children Restored in their families & 32 children transferred to their own location.
- 12 Monthly Child club meeting organised.
- 12 Monthly Home Management Committee Meeting organised with different stack holders.
- Health Check –up of Children's twice in a month.
- Regular recreational classes – Painting, yoga and craft
- Celebrate the important social events

Awareness Programme :

- Involving in Hand wash Campaign
- Yoga classes for proper health management.
- Awareness rally on children's Day against Child labor.
- Participation of children in different competition organized by Bihar Govt.



Promoting Sustainable Sanitation Through Reviving (Defunct) Toilet

Background of Project :

The word "Arghyam" means "offering" in Sanskrit. BJUP Bihar in collaboration with Arghyam Bangalore started a Pilot Project to promote sustainable sanitation by Reviving Toilets (Defunct) and piloting appropriate technology. BJUP implemented this project in Nine Villages of 5 Panchayat of Giriyak Block of Nalanda District. Target groups for the project were women, socially excluded groups, Mahadalits, old age persons, specially challenged persons, girls and school going children. The targeted communities have remained deprived since centuries from provision of water supply and sanitation due to their traditional status as agricultural labors who were destined to live in a very small piece of low land allotted by the landlords for their stay and as a result the whole solid and liquid waste used to get accumulated in their settlement.

The project implemented in selected 9 villages of Giriyak block of Nalanda district of Bihar to provide safe and basic sanitation facilities to the people.

Aim and Objectives :

- Strengthening of village health and sanitation committees: Village health and sanitation committees across all the 9 intervention villages will be strengthened. The regular meeting will be done with them and new information/inputs related to sanitation issues will be given to them to keep them updated so that they can take appropriate action, which needed.
- Repairing of defunct toilets: Defunct toilets across all the intervention villages will be repaired. Contribution from the beneficiary will also be ensured through this activity. We assume the total number will be increase after base line. Due to dissatisfaction of construction quality, some beneficiaries have destroyed the super structure.
- Capacity building of PRI Members: PRI members will be capacitated through capacity building initiatives. The capacitated PRI members will have better understanding on sanitation issues and they will try to include activities related to sanitation issues in developing Panchayat plan. They will play the role of catalyst in sensitizing communities on the same.

Major Works Achievements of the Project :

The Arghyam project has so far created or achieved Social, Environmental and Economic impacts, which are as follows:

Social Impacts :

Large numbers of poor people will attain sustainable access to basic sanitation and adopt good hygiene practices; People will achieve better hygiene outcomes through changed sanitation behaviours. People (in project area) will construct and use more effective sanitation facilities Communities (in project area) will eliminate open defecation. All members of project communities will benefit from project interventions in an equitable manner, Effective use and management of sanitation will be maintained People sustainably will improve their hygiene behaviours.



Environmental Impacts:

Improved quality of drinking water. Pollution of nearby water sources will be reduced by these new constructions.

Economic Impacts :

The tangible benefits of having a toilet are easy to identify and measure – better health, higher levels of education, increased wealth and productivity. Communities who have chosen to end open defecation will be motivated by a strong sense of wanting to improve their lives through better sanitation.



Organisational Development

The Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad Organized "One day orientation programme on Organizational Development" on **09/11/2018** at Bihar Sharif Head Office. The BJUP's board members as well as its team attended the orientation exercise on the organizational development. This orientation programme was organized with the purpose of increasing organizational effectiveness and sharpens its collective approaches to achieve BJUP's mission and vision.

As Organizational Development (OD) is a challenging process. Therefore several OD instruments were adopted during the orientation programme to understand the Strengths and Weaknesses of BJUP and help design strategies to strengthen organizations overall processes for addressing the issues of its target groups consisting of marginalized, vulnerable and underprivileged communities in its operational areas. During the orientation program perspective of team members was also built on some of the thematic issues on which BJUP is working.

In nutshell following were the objectives of the one day orientation programme on Organizational Development:-

- Understanding how BJUP functions
- Determining where the organization is and what path BJUP need to take in immediate future through its programmatic expansion
- Using the BJUP's human and monetary resources to build a viable organization—use what the organization has.
- Planning and implementing actions that enable the BJUP to improve lives of its target groupps—do what BJUP can.
- Strengthening BJUP's ability and capacity to effectively provide services to its various target groups, stakeholders, and constituents of network.
- Becoming a learning organization.
- Continually adapting to changing internal and external environments.
- Strategies of sustaining its finances, operations, and achievement.
- Strengthening the perspective and capacities of team for effective performance to achieve BJUP's mission and visions.



Transparency & Accountability

Governance :

General Body :

General body is supreme body of BJUP that takes major policy decisions for the organization. It comprises of 18 male and female members that have strong willpower of social work. Network, linkage and alliances of the organization

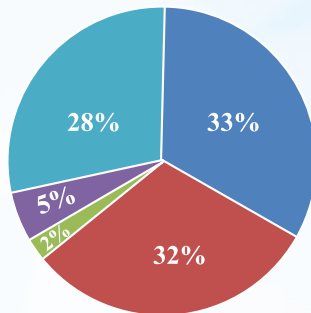

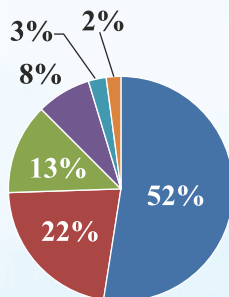
