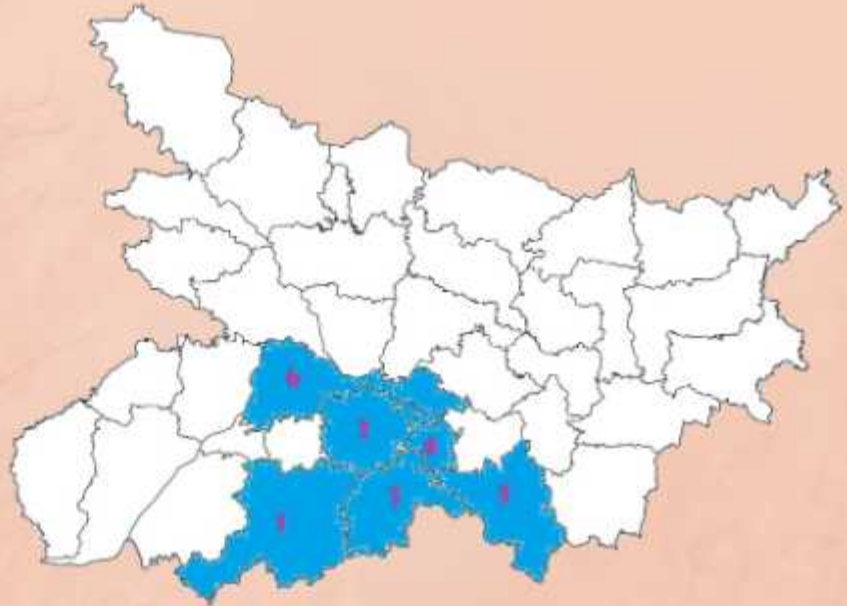

Story that Motivates


Chandan's first step towards education begins at Bal Manch

Thirteen-year-old Chandan, member of Subash Chandra Bose Bal manch who lives in the remote village of Sabalpur Chaorun, is the eldest son of his family lives with mother and Father who works at mica mines. Chandan dreams were shattered when his family asked him to quit studies due to financial crisis. However, Chandan accepted this as his fate but secretly wish to go to school. 'I used to collect mica scraps with my mother and father and earn only one twenty rupees per day' which took most of my time. However, I wanted to continue my education and when I told my parents about it, they refused as they never gave importance to education because for them, putting food on their family's plate was more important.' I always dreamt of working at an office and making my parents proud, but I had no iota of idea that of how to peruse my further studies" says Chandan.

One day, he explored about the "Bal Manch" an initiative of BJUP and started attending the meetings regularly, where he learned more about the importance of education and financial independence. Later on, BJUP team convinced his parents to send him to school. They aware his parents about the benefits of education, government schemes that support free and compulsory education and how their future can be better if he attends school. with the constant efforts of BJUP team, his parents agreed and Chandan was enrolled!

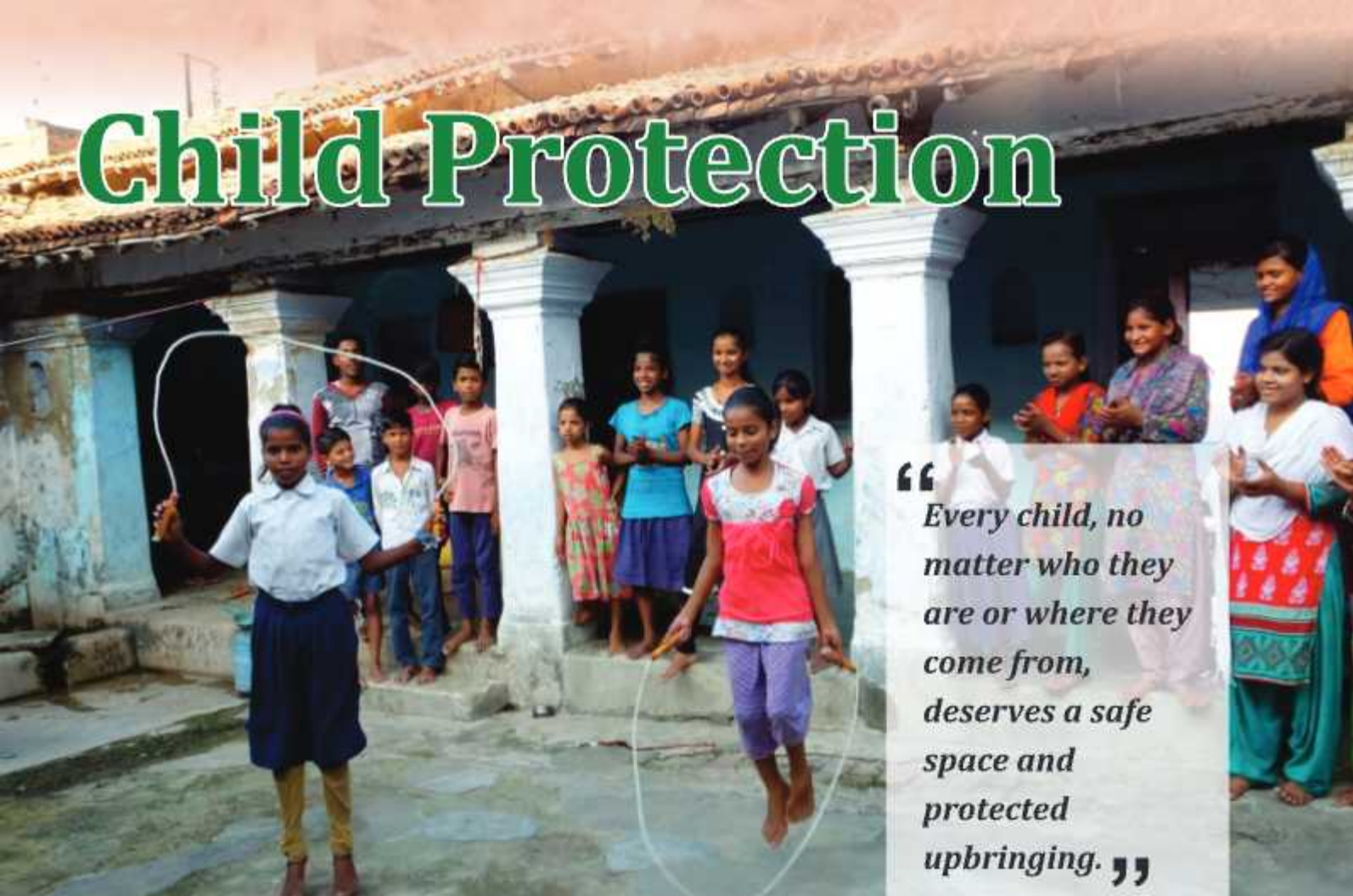
Chandan became a leader of Bal Manch where he creates awareness on the social issues such as child labour and child marriage which are prevalent in the village. Under his leadership, he also motivates other children to join community library established by the BJUP and being operated by Bal Manch team.

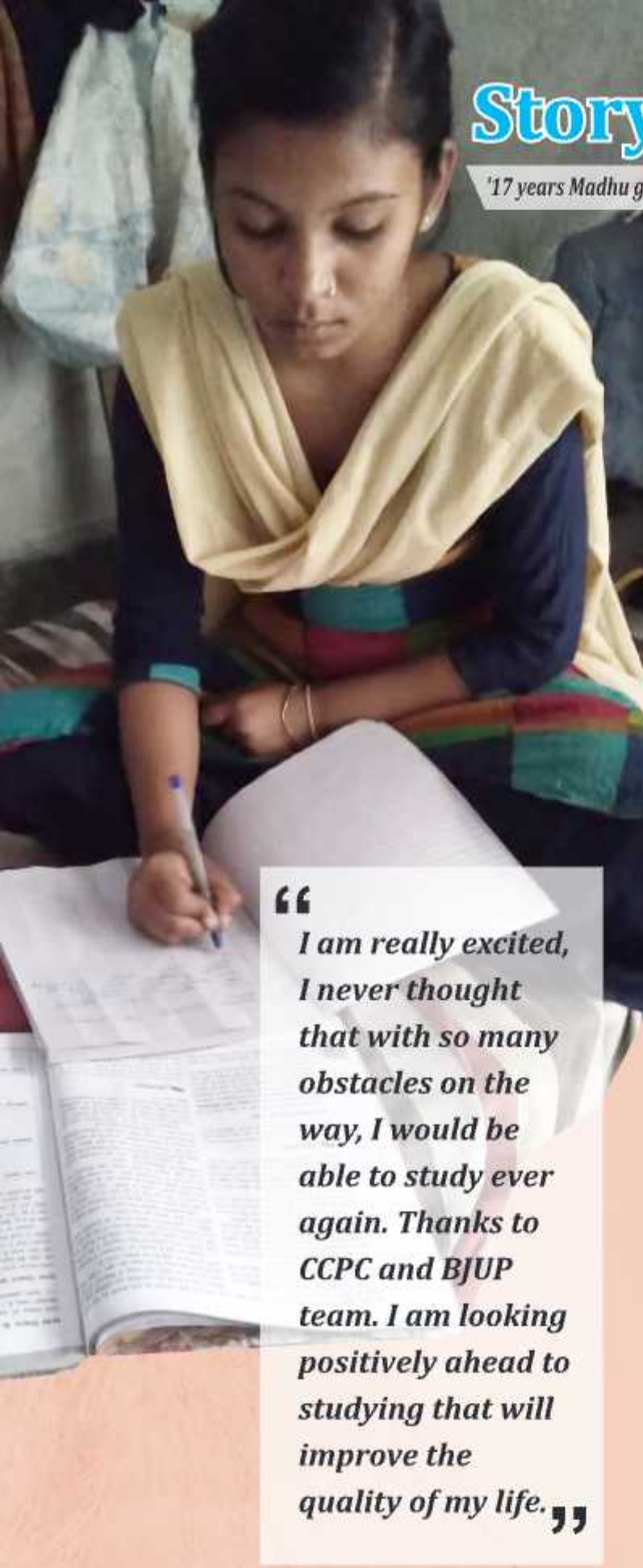

'I love studying and always dreamt of better future' says 17 years old Madhu, daughter of Mamta Devi. Madhu's parents are illiterate like most of the villagers and finding paid work is scarce. Agriculture is not easily possible in the difficult terrain. Few years ago, her father died while working at small construction site in nearby area. Her father was the only possible source of income for her family. Soon Madhu's mother started working as daily wage labour in order to gain financial support. But the earning was not sufficient for the family. Then Madhu was asked to leave her school and support her mother in earning money. Madhu began working as domestic helper where she cooked, cleaned and took care of all other household chores and to earned Rs 500 per month. 'only thing was ever I wanted was to study' said Madhu.

There were still many obstacles to overcome, after few months, Madhu was physically abused, beaten up and kept starving by her employers at home. "I had anxiety attacks because, where am I going to go? and how will I earn money for my family. I used to cry for hours. Said Madhu while sharing her ordeal to Bachpan team.

One day, Community Child Protection committee member Savita Devi informed her mother about the painful situation. Madhu's mother got really concerned and asked Savita Devi for the further assistance. Savita Devi linked Madhu to Bachpan Project and initiative of BJUP with the support of Bachpan team she got enrolled to government school in 6th class. Now Madhu is studying in 11th grade and she also overcame the mental trauma. The team team Bachpan provided her with Books, copies, Ration and tuition fees so that Madhu can continue her studies. 'I like studying and will never quit my school now, Madhu says while expressing her aim to become a teacher'.

The BJPUP continued to focused on marginalized communities to self-resilient and develop their own capabilities and assets. The BJPUP views livelihood through various lenses i.e. existence, persistence and texture of inequalities that exists within and across communities. We provide learning based experience to build a sustainable livelihood through various interventions such as skill development, training and workshop. We also disseminate information needed to engage effectively with government authorities to make vulnerable communities to reach out the social entitlements.

Story that Motivates

Secure and Resilient livelihood for Kalo Devi

Kalo Devi, belonged from a poor background, had never attended school. Due to economic hardships her survival became difficult. In order to earn money, she started collecting Mica and wood from the hills for Mica zone area of Rajauli block, she was not able to survive her family and educate her children she has 2 sons and 2 daughters and her husband is effected by paralysis decease, so she has no option left.

During the interaction with the community, the BJUP team working in Rajauli got to know that kalo Devi need economic support. The team further decided to provide self-sustainable and by which she can generate alternative income from the supported and available resources. The BJUP team has supported Kalo Devi to open small unit of grocery shop, in her own community so that her income level may increase and by which she can survive her family in easily way.

Now she had open her shop beside the highway of her village, which is nearest to her village and home. She is showing her interest to upgrade her business in a growing mode and as per our visit she uses to re-fill the sold item based on the requirement and demand of the community. Now daily she is earning almost 200-250 NIR/- Day and it is her daily income.

The BJUP provides comprehensive approach to implement Health, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) program in community through infrastructure development, community mobilization and behavior change communications to improve sanitation, health and hygiene practices. The BJUP believes to build the strong local partnerships with the communities and concerned government stakeholders to ensure the long-term sustainability of solutions that are equitable, environmentally sound and well-suited to the specific needs of each community.

The BJUP also works addresses community health issues which include Malnutrition, HIV/AIDs and lately the COVID 19 vaccination Program. The BJUP created awareness, ensured improved service delivery to the most marginalised communities specially women and children to receive access to quality of healthcare services.

“Meet HIV positive warriors”



Rajendra Kumar and his son Bittu Kumar both of them are diagnosed with HIV positive and they were not registered in the ART centre. We did not get any medical support from the government and disbursed to the people living with HIV (PLHIV)” says Rajendra. One day, Rajendra and his son Bittu had gone out to get medicines where his son fainted and was carried home. While recounting that day he says” Bittu had a low pulse rate and was breathing heavily and said dad please don't leave my side. “When I used to go to the ART and see people in the queue, hiding their face, not talking to anyone, I wondered 'why should we hide? We should be sharing our experiences'. 'I would try to strike a conversation with the people but only a few would respond.' Said Rajendra.

One day with the help of Local community Mr. Rajendra got to know about the ART centre run by the BJUP, an initiative since 2009, with the objectives of the network is to ensure and advocate for quality care, support and treatment services with dignity, free from stigma and discrimination in the public and private sector for PLHIV and affected communities.

With the support of the BJUP team Rajendra and his son were linked to the ART centre. 'The team BJUP connected with the ART centre and we ensured not only the free treatment but also linked with various government schemes' says while expressing his happiness to the BJUP team. 'feel that we have to continue to address the stigma and strengthen the community support system. We need to educate people about HIV/AIDS so that they are aware of their rights and work towards their protection'. 'I sure that common people like us can be the voices for the people living with HIV.' **Thanks to BJUP team for providing the generous support to me and my son'. Said Rajendra.**

BACHPAN (A PROGRAM OF AZIM PREMJI PHILANTHROPIC INITIATIVES)

“ Building Atmosphere for Children to have Protection & nurturing ”

Background of the Project

“Building Atmosphere for Child’s Holistic Development Protection and Nurturing” or BACHPAN is being contrived in the slum areas of Bihar Sharif town of Nalanda district of Bihar state in the collaboration of Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiative. The project’s goal is to protect children who have been separated from their families for various reasons and to nurture them by providing a safe and nurturing environment. The BACHPAN pilot’s learning and field experience have been incorporated into the design of the BACHPAN scale up in ten slums to provide a comprehensive package of children who are vulnerable and in need of support and help. The project area is primarily populated by minorities, scheduled castes, and other backward communities. It also addresses child labor i.e. Raggpickers, which is universally regarded as hazardous to children’s physical, cognitive and emotional development, and works with children who are either orphan or semi orphan.

Approach

BACHPAN’s initiatives have been based on three core pillars to support children’s physical and psycho-social development:

1. Orphan, semi-orphan and children involved in rag picking or child labour needs proper residential care.
2. A better social infrastructure for children through awareness-raising, training, and capacity building workshops.
3. More chances for children to speak up by engaging in conversation with the administration, teachers, and neighbourhood during the interface meeting.

Implementation

- Periodic meeting with child club, slum committee, guardian committee, local authorities and elected representatives in the slums to support children in need of care and protection.
- Parenting skills training to the families of children in need of care and protection.
- Support to children and their families in the form of tuition, education kit and ration.
- Linkage of children and their families with different government schemes and entitlements.
- Facilitation in the enrolment of the children in schools.

Impact

- 210 families getting benefited throughout the project (90 direct & 120 indirect).
- 90 families are getting support in the form of education kit, ration support and other items.
- 203 parents received training on parenting skills
- 48 families of children in need of care and protection are linked with different government entitlements and schemes.
- 193 children regularly attending the classes.
- 26 children enrolled in nearest government school.



BACHPAN (A PROGRAM OF STITCHING KINDERPOSTZEGELS, NETHERLANDS)

“ Building Atmosphere for Child’s Holistic Development Protection and Nurturing ”

Background of the Project

The project "Building Atmosphere for Child's Holistic Development Protection and Nurturing," or BACHPAN, is being implemented in seven slums of Bihar Sharif town in the Nalanda district of Bihar state in collaboration with the Stitching Kinder postzegels, Nederland. This project focuses on orphan and semi-orphan children's holistic development, protection, and nurturing. Three perspectives are used in this initiative to solve societal challenges. It first provides kinship care to children who are without one or both of their parents but live with their closest relatives. Second, it focuses on children who do not have a parent or a living relative but have siblings and are in independent care. Third, it focuses on children who do not have parents or closest guardians and are raised by different families.

Approach

BACHPAN's initiatives have been based on three core pillars to support children's physical and psycho-social development:

1. Children in residential care have better psychological health than children in institutional care.
2. Improved social environment for children through sensitization, training, and workshops.
3. Increased opportunities for children to raise their voices through dialogue with administration, teachers, and community in the interface meeting.

Implementation

- Periodic meeting with child club, slum committee, guardian committee, local authorities and elected representatives in the slums to support children in need of care and protection.
- Life skills training to children to promote individual thinking, leadership, communication and other skills.
- Support to children and their families in the form of tuition, education kit and ration.
- Linkage of children and their families with different government schemes and entitlements.
- Up gradation of schools and AWCs in the slum to support social environment of education.
- Facilitation in the enrolment of the children in schools.

Impact

- 242 Children are getting tuition assistance to continue their education
- 436 children provided with books and study materials to enhance their cognitive and social development.
- 263 children are enrolled in schools.
- 5 government schools have been provided study materials and sanitary napkins.
- 11 AWC has been provided with essential goods such as white board, chalk and other items.
- 469 individuals and children are linked social entitlements and schemes for the families of Children in need of care and protection.
- 164 children received game kit support for psychological development of children.
- 50 families are supported in the form of ration support.



Community Empowerment Program (A PROGRAM OF RESPONSIBLE MICA INITIATIVES, Paris)

Project Background

The project Community Empowerment Program is an initiative project of Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad that collaborates with Jharkhand NGOs such as Abhivyakti Foundation (Giridih), Samajik Parivartan Sansthan (Giridih), and Samarpan (Koderma) to form a consortium with the support of Responsible Mica Initiatives, Paris. In this project, Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad serves as the lead partner as well as the implementing organization in two blocks. The project operates in 50 villages throughout Bihar and Jharkhand. To transform the community in the mica region for long-term and self-sustaining solutions to the underlying causes of poverty, vulnerability, and illiteracy, the project is being implemented in 30 villages in Jharkhand's Giridih and Koderma districts, as well as 20 villages in Bihar's Jamui and Rajauli districts.

Approach

1. Five focus domains for community empowerment: Livelihood, Education, Social Entitlements, Health & WASH and Advocacy.
2. Individual, small-group, and large-group activities.
3. Promoting the upward mobility of ultra-poor households based on graduation model.
4. Infrastructural development of villages to increase capability of the community.

Implementation

- Assets Building Support to the ultra-poor households.
- Vocational training of local youths.
- Financial Literacy Session to the community.
- Training and distribution of seeds for Kitchen Garden.
- Scholarship support to needy children.
- Establishment of Balwadi centres, school and community library.
- Provision of sports and teaching learning materials in schools.
- Trainings for capacity building of teachers and balmanch.
- Organization of Health Camps for the rural population
- Awareness campaign for preventive measures of health and hygiene.
- Linkages camps for social entitlements and rights.
- Establishment of Resource Centre to promote social entitlements linkages.

Impact

- 48 families are supported with assets to increase their income.
- 36 youths received training on stitching, beauty and other trades.
- 217 women received training on financial literacy.
- 100 households received training and seeds for kitchen garden.
- 18 students received scholarship to continue their education.
- 2 health camps are organized for more than 300 individuals for the community.
- 9 preventive sessions are organized to support basic health and hygiene.
- 4 Balwadi centres are established for more than 100 children.
- 6 schools received sports and teaching learning materials.
- 332 individuals are linked with different social entitlements and rights.



**Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP) Parivartan
(Supported by HDFC Bank, CSR)**

Project Background

The Project "HRDP" revolves around the holistic development of the rural periphery of Nawada District with the support of HDFC Bank, Parivartan. It attempts to provide rural communities, with the tools and means to grow and prosper. HRDP's several initiatives such as education, livelihood, infrastructure, natural resource management, and water management will have a major impact on the target group in the short and long term to create a sustainable community. The major focus of this project is the right management and techniques with the help of skill development and training to make vulnerable communities tackle the vagaries of nature efficiently. This initiative will also help to mitigate the poverty condition which is now acute against the backdrop of decreasing farm productivity. This also focuses on the other components such as ICDS, infrastructure development of schools and AWCs, awareness and support for the preventive measures of health, promotion of natural farming and usage of advanced techniques.

Approach

1. Four Focus Components: Education, Livelihood, Health & WASH, and Natural Resource Management.
2. Activities for large and small groups as well as individuals.
3. Entrepreneurship development in the village.
4. Promotion of natural farming for livelihood promotion.
5. Infrastructural development to ensure the accessibility of health and education.

Implementation

- Awareness and promotion of soil testing for the better agriculture practice.
- Promotion of poultry farming in the villages.
- Organization of veterinary camps in the villages.
- Renovation of existing hand pumps in the villages.
- Formation of Village Development Committee and Farmers Development Committee.
- Renovation and Beautification of Aganwadi Centers.

Impact

- 200 farmers are supported and trained about soil testing for best agriculture practices.
- 150 hand pumps are renovated in 15 villages.
- 15 veterinary camps have been organized for more than 400 beneficiaries.
- 406 farmers are enrolled in farmers' development committee.
- 15 beneficiaries get support for the establishment of poultry farm.
- One Aganwadi is renovated to ensure six services of ICDS.



**DIGITAL CLASSROOM PROGRAM
(A COLLAB WITH E-VIDYALOKA)**

Project Background

To keep up with the government education system, Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad, with the assistance of Evidyaloka Bangalore, is running the Vidyaganga & Digital Classroom program with two schools in the Giriyak block of the Nalanda district. Under this project, government school's children receive digital education with the assistance of highly qualified volunteer teachers and professionals. This project facilitates the children with the grade of 5th to 8th. Digital classroom program or e-education is a new concept soon after the world faced pandemic and lockdown as its affect. The use of technology was introduced to fix the education systems in the loopholes, but soon after the realization of lockdown and pandemic, it became the need of the phase. The project E-Vidyaloka runs on two different dynamics of assisting education to the children.

Approach

1. Innovative Learning Content for school and students is created and hosted on a android applications
2. Digital Infrastructure of tablets and smart phones that is maintained by social infrastructure of parents, teachers and school management committee.

Implementation

- Enrolment of children to the digital learning.
- Counselling and mentoring of children to access the digital education.
- Conduct feedback sessions with parents, teachers and school management committee on learning.

Impact

- 443 children are enrolled in the digital education.
- Increase in the attendance and learning of the students in the classroom.
- Two Children secured second in the national science Olympiad and received a monetary prize of Rs. 25,000.



Vihaan (Collaboration with UPNP + Lucknow)

Background of the project

The BJUP is implementing Vihaan project for care and support of HIV/AIDS positive people with the support of Uttar Pradesh Welfare for People Living with HIV/AIDS Society. Vihaan is a national initiative establishing and managing 350 Care & Support Centres (CSCs) across India to expand access to essential services, increase treatment adherence, reduce stigma and discrimination, and improve the quality of life of people living with HIV (PLHIV). As Vihaan CSCs, BJUP is committed to the health and wellbeing of all PLHIV and their affected families, with special effort to reach those from underserved populations, including women, children, and members of high-risk groups, FSW, MSM, transgender and people who inject drugs (PWID).

Approach

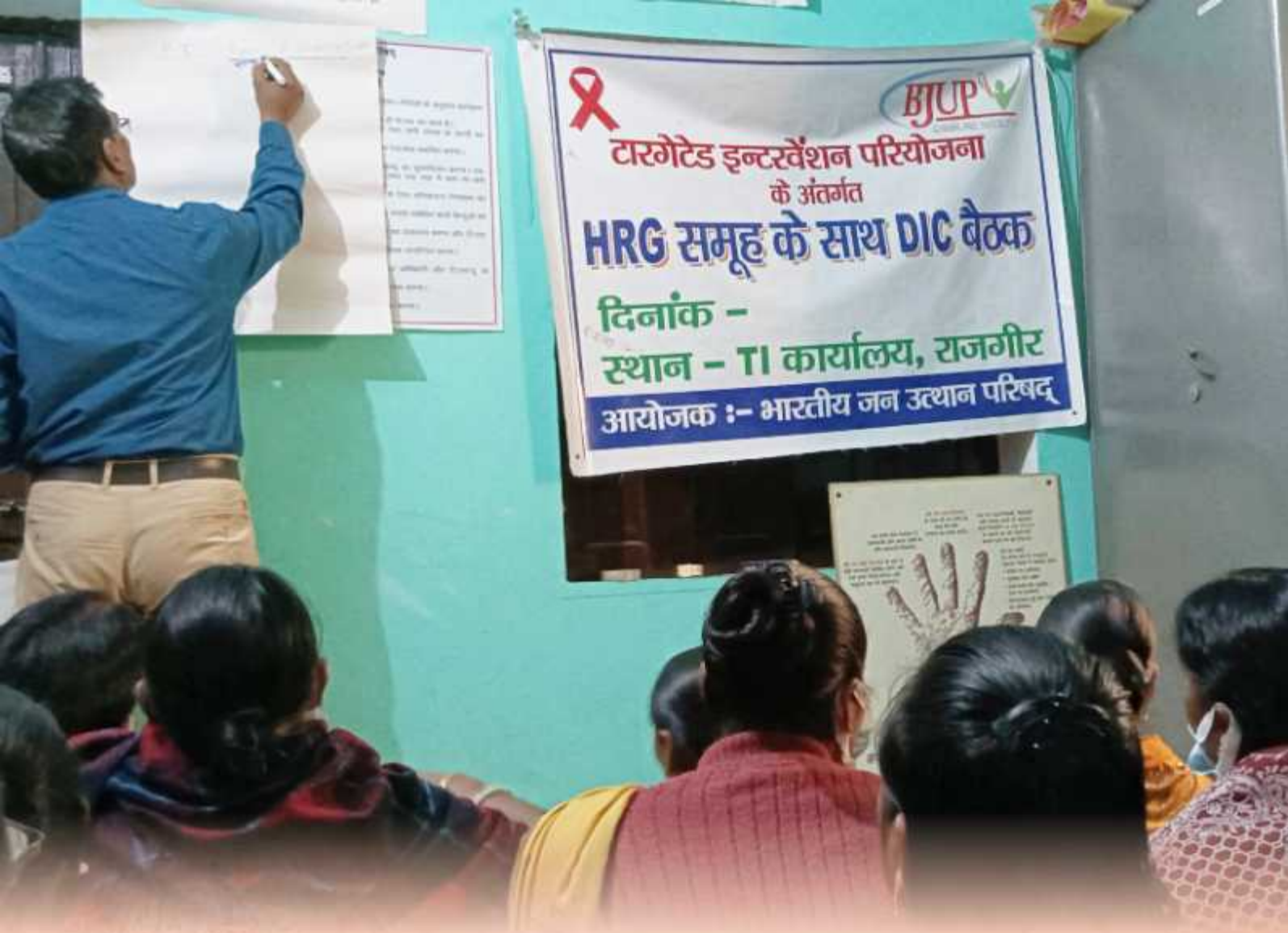
1. Holistic and participatory approach for People Living with HIV.
2. Provisioning the social and psychological support to the PLHIV.

Implementation

- Awareness of the community about PLHIV.
- Counselling of people living with HIV.
- Registration of PLHIV for Ante-Retroviral Therapy.
- Follow up and referral services for people living with HIV.

Impact

- 5973 patients in total were registered and receiving ART support.
- Follow-up has been completed for 2544 ART-related patients.
- 824 patients must receive referral services.
- 2428 patients received counselling service.
- 244 patients are linked with Bihar AIDS Shatabdi Schemes.
- 9 patients linked with Parwarish scheme.



TARGETED INTERVENTION (In collaboration with Bihar State AIDS Control Society, Bihar)

Project Background

BJUP with the collaboration of Bihar state AIDS control society had started the project with the aimed to target the 700 lives HRG. This project with the name Targeted intervention is running on four block of Nalanda District of Bihar state. The HRG who are in the age group of 18-45 years, are eligible to register under this project. Currently total 731 HRG are getting services from this program among which 628 are FSW and 103 are MSM.

Approach

1. Prioritize the prevention of new infections and improve client adherence to HIV prevention services.
2. Empowering female sex workers, male sex with male worker and the communities to address their needs and challenges.
3. Ensuring the right to Health Based Approach.

Implementation

- Awareness campaign among the communities regarding
- Liaoning with stakeholders related to HIV AIDS welfare.
- Linkages with social security schemes and entitlements.
- Counselling of people living with HIV.
- Registration of PLHIV for Ante-Retroviral Therapy.
- Follow up and referral services for people living with HIV.

Impacts

- 2924 high risk group and community people have been rendered through regular counselling.
- 11 patients are identified and treated for sexual transmitted disease.
- 2558 patients received regular health check-up.
- 43058 free Condom were distributed among the targeted group through the outlets.
- 1332 FSW and MSM received services for STI check-ups.
- 12 beneficiaries received crisis support to reintegrate their family.



COVID 19 vaccination Program

The program 'Covid-19 vaccination promotion project' which is implemented by Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad in collaboration with Azim Premji Foundation came into the picture for building the trust and promote acceptance among the community in the remote and marginalized areas where government is lacking due to several factors such as infrastructure, trained personnel and others.

This project is implemented in eight public health centers in eight blocks of five districts i.e., Gaya, Jamui, Nawada, and Nalanda. The first phase of the project implementation started in September 2020 in Biharsharif block of Nalanda and Giriyak block of Nawada district. The scale up implementation has been done in Gaya and Bodh Gaya blocks of Gaya, Rajauli block of Nawada and Sono block of Jamui. Moreover, BJUP also acted for technical and coordination support for other organizations such as Jan Jagran Sansthan, Project Potential, Bihar Voluntary Health Association, Save the Children, Integrated Development Foundations, Gram Vikash Samiti, Gram Swaraj Samiti, Nirdesh, Sakhi, and Save the Children in the project. It is a much needed project for the community for their wellbeing. Hence, it provides us opportunity to learn different aspects from the project.

Approach

1. All individuals and populations should have equitable vaccine access.
2. Dissemination of timely, accurate and transparent information about the vaccine(s) to alleviate apprehensions about the vaccine ensures its acceptance and encourage uptake.

Implementation

- Providing technical support to the partner organizations.
- Awareness campaign through audio-video visuals in the community.
- Organization of vaccination camp in the remote areas.
- Liasoning with Public Health Centres.
- Support to Public Health Centres to organize vaccination camps.

Impact

- 661 vaccination camps have been organized.
- 134000+ people get the vaccination.
- 718 villages have been covered for awareness.
- 12 partners are trained and supported for vaccination programme.
- 12 technical sessions have been organized for the partners.



COVID Affected Children

With COVID-19 continuing to pose a serious public health challenge, we recognise that it is significantly affecting the lives of many, especially the poorest and most vulnerable communities with whom we work. To cope up with this unprecedented catastrophe, BJUP with the collaboration of Azim Premji Foundation started a 6-month project to reach out to 419 children who have lost parents to COVID 19, across 6 districts (Patna, Nawada, Nalanda, Sheikhpura, Jamui, Gaya) by providing counselling support, dry rations (as needed), support to continue education, and linkages to government schemes and support systems.

Approach

1. Focus on orphaned adolescents who require support for personal autonomy and transitioning to adulthood, and for younger children who require more immediate nurturing.
2. Special attention to girls who might be more likely to be expected to take up household responsibilities, and subsequently underperform academically.

Implementation

- Poverty, hunger, threat, and Protection analysis of each identified children
- Counselling of children in trauma.
- Instant food support to all needy children & follow-up for further support.
- Re-enrolment to school as per their age and provide education support.
- Linkage with the social entitlements and schemes.

Impact

- 555 Families are supported through ration kit.
- 332 Children received education kit to continue their education.
- 412 Children are provided counselling.
- 129 Families got Supported Rs 4 Lakh under Ex Gratia scheme of Bihar government.
- 138 Children got linked with Bal Sahayata Yojna & getting Rs 2000 per children for education support till 18 age.
- 81 families are linked with different social entitlements and schemes.



COVID 19 Emergency Response

In the second wave of COVID-19, the highly affected areas in Bihar were recognized in Nalanda and Nawada, especially the rural peripheries of both the districts. The people who came back to their homes, fearing of COVID 19 lockdown had made the district vulnerable for others as there was virus transmission was haunting every resident of these two districts.

Therefore, Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad with support of Azim Premji Foundation and Argyham Bangalore, set up distribution of covid preventive kit for frontline workers and medicine kit for covid infected patients, in collaboration, in two districts of Bihar, i.e., Nawada and Nalanda. The idea of providing support is because of the continuous work the frontline workers are involved in. The constant service different personnel are providing amidst surge in cases, it is therefore, to prevent them from the exposure of deadly virus and also to extend our support and care to the COVID positive patients. The operational areas are as follows: 1. Mild COVID patient's residence across any villages of Nalanda and Rajauli block of Nawada district 2. Designated Vaccination Centre 3. District Hospital and PHC 4. Police station of Bihar Sharif 5. Media Houses of Bihar Sharif. Our target segment was: 1. Front Line workers at Vaccination Centre 2. Law enforcement personnel 3. Media Personnel 4. COVID positive patients.



Child line India Foundation

The BJUP with collaboration of Childline India Foundation implementing child line project as a collab in Nalada District for the protection of rights of all children aged from 0-18 years. It is an initiative for rescuing, assisting children in distress. The Project focus children in need and care and protection, specially the more vulnerable sections including victims of child sexual abuse.

Approach

1. Rescuing and assisting children in distress.
2. Focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially the more vulnerable sections, including victims of child sexual abuse.

Implementation

- Operating 365 days a year, free, emergency phone service for children in need of aid and assistance.
- Intervention and case follow-up on a daily basis.
- Awareness and outreach in the community on a daily basis.
- Monthly open house with children who are users of the CHILDLINE service and to understand issues that concern them

Impacts

- 40 cases are registered for medical emergency, child missing, physical assault and education support and reintegrate the same.
- Four children are supported through scholarship.
- Eight missing children are reintegrated in the family.

Lockdown, against COVID-19 has been an unprecedented event in the history of the world. With this swap of life, there emerged a big transformation within the day-to-day activities of families. Sense of anxiety and fear has swathed the entire globe. During this time of uncertainties, a strategy was made with the support Kurl On CSR India to support Government and Private health institutions, for better amenities for patients in the hospitals. A total of 225 mattresses have been distributed in five hospitals of Nawada, Nalanda and Patna.

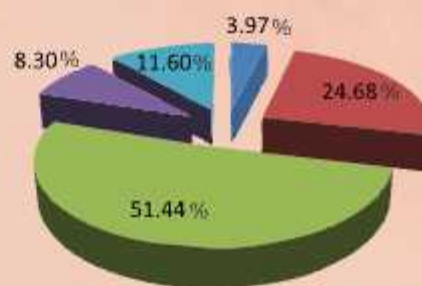

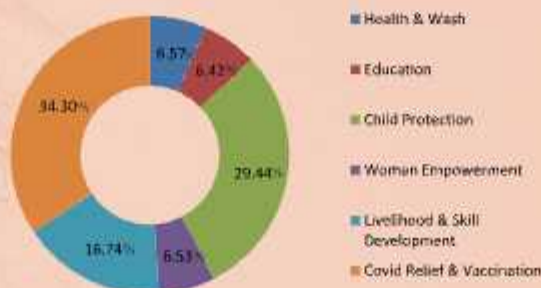
