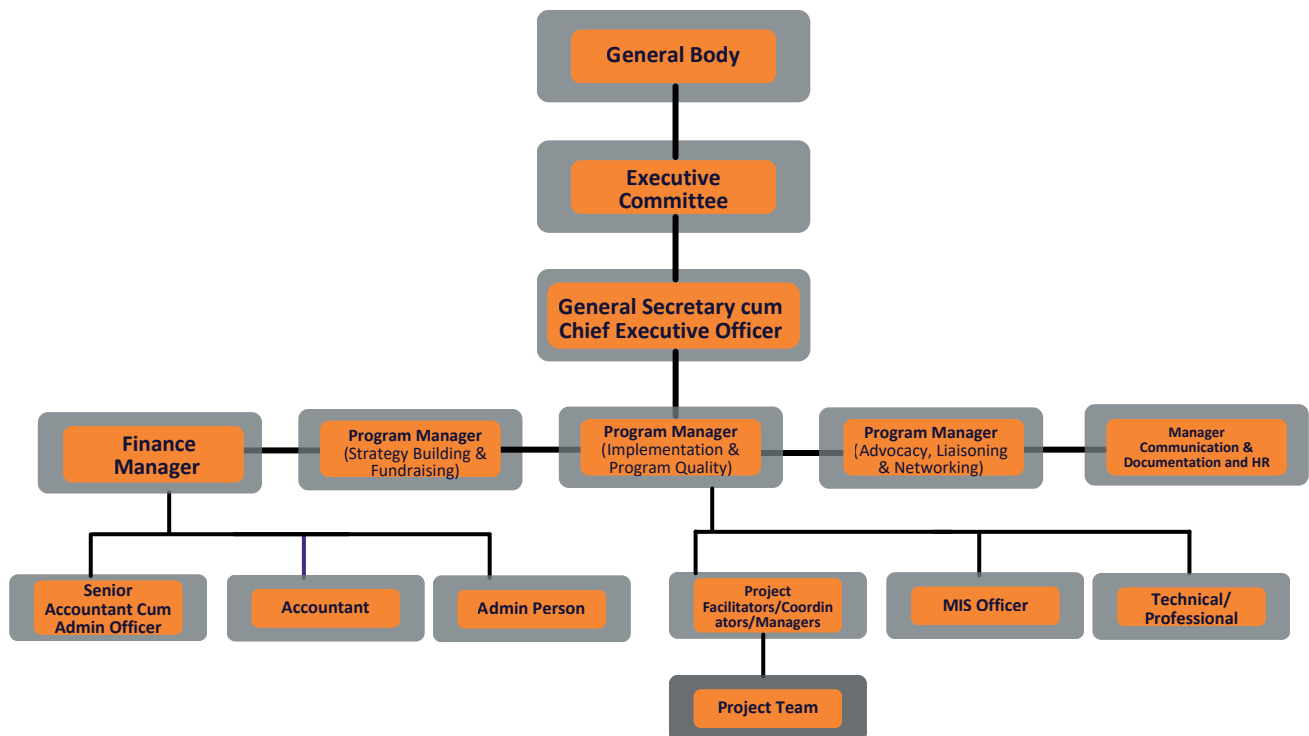

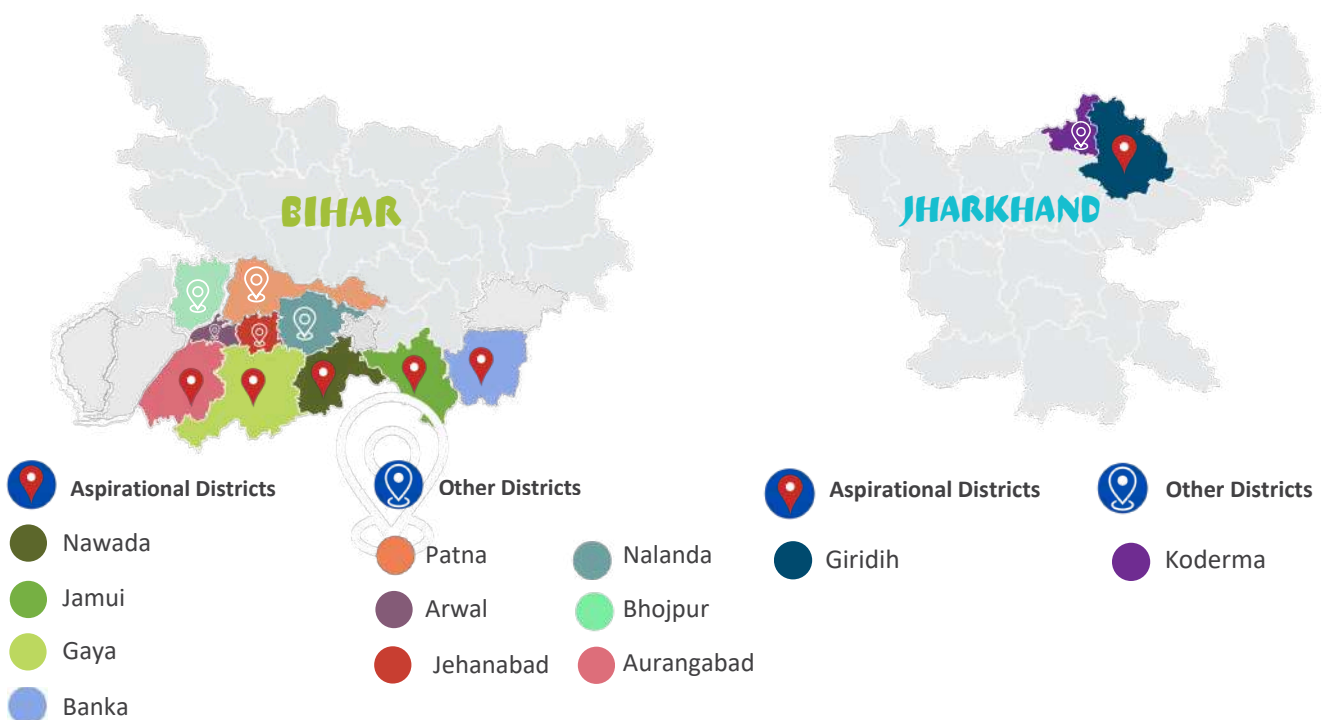

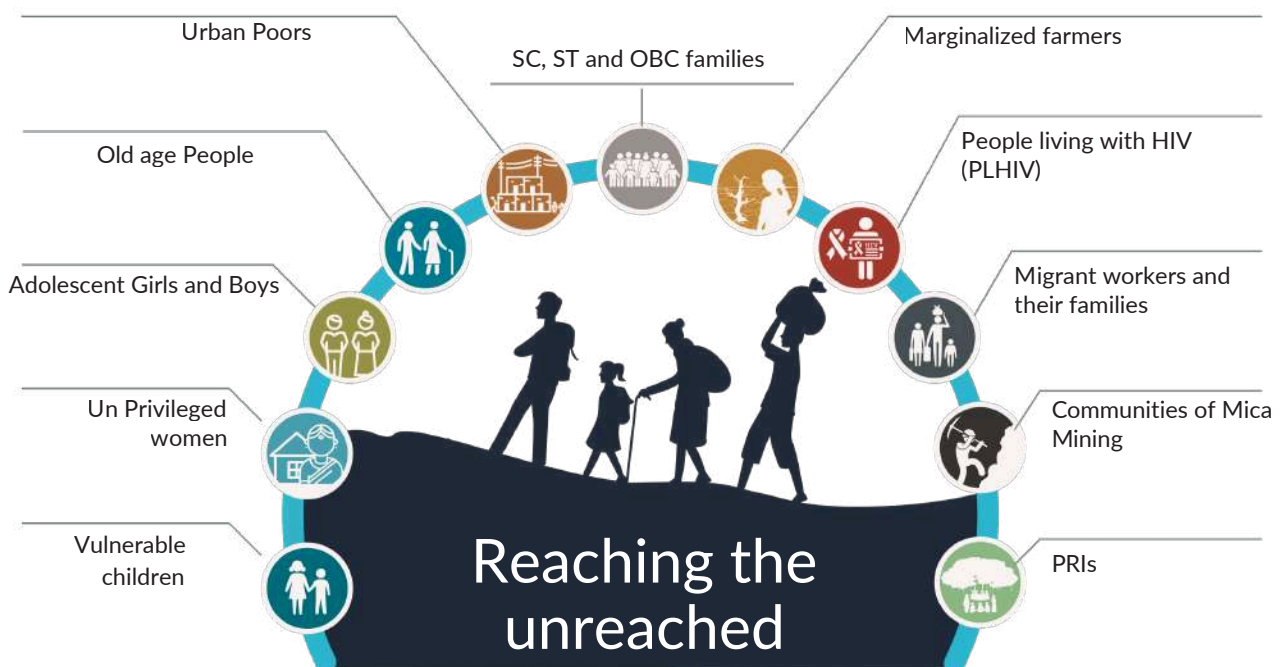

The Community Empowerment Program is making a significant difference across 50 villages in the mica-rich regions of Bihar and Jharkhand. Through a holistic and integrated approach, the program addresses five critical pillars: livelihood enhancement, education promotion, access to social entitlements, Health & WASH improvements, and community advocacy. The primary aim is to uplift ultra-poor households by fostering sustainable, long-term solutions tailored to the unique needs of each community. A wide range of interventions support this mission from providing asset-building assistance and vocational training to organizing financial literacy sessions and distributing kitchen garden seeds. The program also invests in children's futures through scholarships and educational infrastructure development, promotes health through regular camps and hygiene awareness initiatives, and ensures greater access to social welfare schemes.

The Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP), implemented in partnership with HDFC Bank CSR initiative Parivartan, is focused on driving comprehensive growth across 15 villages in Warsaliganj block of Nawada district. At its core, the project seeks to empower vulnerable communities by building their skills and capacities, helping them better navigate environmental and economic challenges. Addressing the urgent issue of rural impoverishment particularly the decline in agricultural yields and the initiative emphasizes on improving farming techniques and promoting sustainable resource management. A major focus is placed on strengthening the educational infrastructure by upgrading schools and Anganwadi Centres (AWCs), thereby creating nurturing learning spaces under the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) framework. HRDP promotes health and hygiene awareness within the community to encourage better practices and outcomes, while supporting the adoption of sustainable agriculture to boost both productivity and environmental health.

HDFC Bank, in partnership with B hartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP), has launched the Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP) to address the socio-economic challenges faced by rural communities in Shahpur and Bihiya blocks of Bhojpur district, Bihar. The initiative is set to improve the quality of life for the residents of 15 villages, focusing on the sectors of agriculture, livelihoods, health, education, and natural resource management. The program will span over three years and six months, from October 2024 to March 2028. The selected villages from Bihiya block include Teghra, Doghra, Birpur, Ranisagar, and Kundersar, while the 10 villages from Shahpur block are Sahjauli, Suhiya, Sarna, Hariharpur, Bemari, Karnamenpur, Isharpura, Parsonda, Sonbarsa, and Ramdatahi. These villages were primarily selected based on the alignment of HRDP activities such as millet processing, vegetable production, and other developmental initiatives. The primary beneficiaries of the HRDP are farmers, women entrepreneurs, youth, students, and marginalized communities living in the 15 target villages. The project has created measurable, positive changes in 15 villages, promoting an integrated model of rural development. It has strengthened local institutions, enhanced agricultural practices, improved health and sanitation conditions, supported marginalized women, and improved learning environments for children.

The initiative by the Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB) in collaboration with HDFC Bank, CSR Parivartan to support the meritorious students from underprivileged sections of society is a critical step towards addressing disparities in higher education access and attainment. These students have demonstrated outstanding academic performance by ranking among the top scorers in their matriculation exams despite facing significant socio-economic challenges and limited resources. This project is designed to bridge the gap in educational opportunities for students from remote and extremely backward areas of Bihar, ensuring they have the necessary support to pursue higher education in prestigious technical institutes through JEE and NEET examinations.

The initiative was implemented by the Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB) in all 9 Commissionaires which includes Patna (Bakipore girls' High school, Patna collegiate, shastri Nagar boys high school, shastri Nagar girls high school).

The role of BJUP in the procurement of Smart Class equipment and study materials for the initiative by the Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB) is crucial in ensuring that meritorious students from underprivileged sections have the necessary tools and resources to succeed. BJUP supports the provision of essential resources, including smart class equipment, books, and study materials, which created an enabling environment for students aiming for higher education through exams like JEE and NEET and thereby promoting long-term socio-economic upliftment for students from remote and extremely backward areas of Bihar.

"BACHPAN" is a initiative by BJUP, reaching out to children in 10 slums and 30 Gram Panchayats across Nalanda, Nawada, and Patna districts in Bihar. At its heart, the project is about giving orphaned and semi-orphaned children a chance to grow up in a safe, supportive, and caring environment. Recognizing the harsh realities many children face especially those forced into rag picking and other forms of labour BACHPAN works to protect their childhood and nurture their emotional and cognitive development. The initiative focuses on three core pillars: providing loving and secure alternative care, strengthening the social ecosystem through awareness and community education, and most importantly, empowering children by encouraging their voices and active participation. On the ground, BACHPAN collaborates with local partners to provide parenting guidance, educational support, and access to essential government welfare schemes. It also helps children enroll in schools and ensures they receive the care they need to stay healthy by offering regular health check-ups, counselling, and emotional support. To build a stronger, more protective community, the project forms child protection committees, establishes child-friendly spaces, and offers vocational training for older children preparing for adulthood. Through this comprehensive approach, BJUP envisions a future where every child regardless of their background can live with dignity, pursue their dreams, and grow into a confident, resilient individual.

BACCHE – Two Feet Ahead Together’ is an initiative being implemented in the Rajauli of Nawada and Domchanch of Koderma District in Bihar and Jharkhand respectively with a mission to nurture the overall growth and well-being of children. At its core, the program believes that every child deserves not just access to education, but also the emotional strength and resilience to thrive in life. The initiative puts children and young people at the centre encouraging their voices, creativity, and leadership. It works to build a nurturing environment where children feel seen, heard, and supported. By raising awareness around mental health, encouraging open conversations within communities, and involving stakeholders, BACCHE is helping break the silence around emotional struggles that many children face. With learning resource centres, teacher training, and active involvement of parents, the initiative strengthens the educational ecosystem from the ground up. What makes BACCHE truly impactful is its deep connection with the community. By listening to local voices and working with grassroots organizations, the program constantly adapts and evolves to meet real needs.

Adolescents in rural areas of Bihar face numerous challenges related to Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR). These challenges include limited access to information, substance abuse, and the prevalence of child marriage. Keeping these factors into consideration an innovative Project on SRHR implemented with kind support of Kinderpostzegels in the same villages where Two Feet Ahead Together (TFAT) Project is being implemented.

Out-of-school intervention was implemented in 5 of the 20 intervention villages of Two Feet Ahead Together Project (TFAT) with support from Kinderpostzegels. This intervention required due to several factors, including limited access to quality education, socio-economic challenges, and cultural barriers. Many children in these villages face obstacles such as early marriage, and a lack of infrastructure, which prevent them from attending school. especially for girls. By implementing targeted interventions, such as community-based education programs, skill-building workshops, and awareness campaigns, we tried to bridge the educational gap, empower children, and contributed to long-term socio-economic development in these villages.

This project represents a start towards reinventing learning for over 5000 students who have long been deprived of digital exposure, not only an infrastructural improvement. Many from underprivileged areas, these children will now have access to interactive digital materials, solar-powered smart TVs, and interesting, curriculum-aligned multimedia tools.

We especially thank LIC HFL Ltd. for believing in the power of education and helping us to close the digital divide. Through School Management Committees, their support is empowering teachers and communities as well as students by developing capacities, raising awareness, and encouraging local ownership.

In classrooms formerly mute, together we are planting the seeds of inquiry, confidence, and ability. This project is fostering visions and a better, more inclusive future for rural India by empathy, dedication, and teamwork.

BJUP, with the support of eVidyaloka, is undertaking the implementation of the Vidyaganga and Digital Classroom Program in 20 Schools of Giriya and Biharsharif Block of Nalanda District, Sirdala block of Nawada District and Sono block of Jamui District. This forward-thinking initiative is designed to provide government school children with access to high-quality digital education. The program is supported by a network of highly qualified volunteer teachers and professionals who are dedicated to enhancing the educational experience for these students. The eVidyaloka program operates on two primary fronts. The first is focused on enrolling children in digital learning platforms and equipping them with innovative educational content that is delivered through Android applications. This approach ensures that students are engaged with interactive and up-to-date learning materials that are designed to meet their educational needs in a digital age. The second aspect of the program is the development and provision of essential digital infrastructure. These Key achievements: includes supplying tablets and smartphones to children, as well as extending these resources to parents and the School Management Committee. By establishing this digital infrastructure, the program ensures that students have the necessary tools to fully participate in digital learning, and that parents and school administrators are equipped to support and manage this new mode of education.

The Khula Aasmaan project, launched in June 2024 and implemented by Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad with support from the Share and Care Foundation, was designed as a holistic empowerment initiative targeting adolescent girls and women in rural Nalanda. The program addressed socio-economic barriers and gender-based discrimination by providing practical vocational skills in tailoring, beautician services, and self-defence. The initiative aimed to foster financial independence, boost confidence, and develop leadership among women. Throughout the reporting period, more than 250 women were trained, surpassing initial targets. The program also served as a catalyst for community transformation by promoting gender equality and inspiring broader social participation. With an emphasis on sustainability and community integration, the project has laid a strong foundation for long-term empowerment of Nalanda's underserved communities

Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP), in line with its commitment to enhance livelihood opportunities for youth, has joined hands with the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) to implement the Government of India's flagship initiative Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana 4.0 (PMKVY 4.0). In response to the National Skill Development Corporation's (NSDC) invitation for institutional participation, BJUP (through Devendra Industrial Training Centre – PR10000339) has been sanctioned a target of 240 youth to be trained during the financial year. As part of the onboarding process, BJUP has begun participating in the capacity-building and handholding workshops organised by NSDC to familiarise itself with the revised contours of the scheme and the detailed operational guidelines. Through this initiative, BJUP seeks to integrate vocational education with mainstream academics and create an enabling ecosystem where rural and marginalised young people can access industry-aligned skills, benefit from digital and innovative learning practices and develop a clear pathway to dignified employment and self-reliance.

The vidya-Each one Teach Many is the initiative with the support of Rotary India Literacy Mission is implemented in Domchanch block in Koderma district. Domchanch block is one of the mica dependent regions with the limited involvement in agriculture. The region, historically reliant on mica mining, has suffered economic setbacks due to the decline of formal mining operations. The Adult Literacy Program is launched with the aim of empowering non-literate adults with the ability to read, write, recognize and perform basic arithmetic. Recognizing that education is a fundamental right, the program was initiated to address the high illiteracy rate among adults in marginalized communities, especially women, daily wage workers, and elderly individuals who had previously missed out on formal education opportunities. By adopting this multi-faceted monitoring strategy, the BJUP ensured that the adult literacy programme is well-managed, continuously improved, and capable of making a meaningful impact on the lives of the beneficiaries in the mica belt region. This approach not only enhanced literacy levels but also contributed to the socio-economic upliftment of the entire community.

Chhalaang Project is an impactful initiative by Dani Sports Foundation (DSF) and Aspirational District Collaborative (Piramal Foundation), in collaboration with Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP), working towards the advancement of sports in Gaya Block, Bihar. The core mission of the Chhalaang Project is to empower children and youth by integrating sports into their daily lives, ensuring they not only excel in academics but also develop physically, mentally, and emotionally. This initiative focuses on promoting physical fitness, well-being, and a culture of sportsmanship among students. By working with 50 middle schools across Gaya Block, the project provides a structured sports curriculum, training for teachers, and access to high-quality sporting facilities. The goal is to play sports a key part of every child's education, fostering skills such as teamwork, discipline, and resilience. What truly sets Chhalaang apart is its focus on community engagement. Through collaboration with local schools, parents, and community leaders, the initiative ensures that the program is tailored to the unique needs of each school and its students. By encouraging active participation, raising awareness about the benefits of physical fitness, and breaking down barriers to access, the project is steadily building a sustainable sports ecosystem in Gaya Block.

BJUP, with the support of CHRI and The Global Fund, is implementing a comprehensive program aimed at improving the survival and quality of life for People Living with HIV (PLHIV) across multiple districts, including Gaya, Arwal, Jehanabad, Aurangabad, Nalanda, Nawada, and the border areas of Sasaram in Bihar and neighboring Jharkhand. This initiative is designed to strengthen the community system by reducing stigma and discrimination against PLHIVs, thereby fostering an inclusive environment that supports their health and well-being. The program focuses on providing essential healthcare, mental health support, and creating a stigma-free environment for PLHIV. With the help of dedicated outreach teams and community leaders, the project works to enhance awareness, promote positive behavioral changes, and ensure that PLHIV have access to the healthcare services and social support they need. The program includes conducting widespread awareness campaigns, providing counseling services, and establishing linkages with health facilities for regular check-ups and treatments. Through community-based initiatives and training programs, the project also builds the capacity of local leaders and health workers to offer support and reduce discrimination, making a long-lasting impact on the lives of PLHIVs and the broader community.

Healing Hands: Building confidence and care through First Aid

The training gave me the confidence to help village kids when he cut his hand badly. I cleaned and dressed the wound properly, and he recovered without any complications.

Bhaur, a village in Rajauli Block, which comes under Sirodabar Panchayat under Rajauli block of Nawada district belongs to the state of Bihar. This village is situated on the opposite of Phulwariya Dam. The people of the village choose Mica and Agriculture work for their livelihood and does wood picking. In a small village with limited healthcare facilities, BJUP team at Rajauli initiated a first aid training program for community to empower them with life-saving skills.

Through the support of RMI under the CEP project, the First Aid Kit Training program were conducted in the Oct'24 by a certified trainer (Suhani Sinha-ANM) with extensive experience in first aid and emergency response. The training consisted of both theoretical and practical sessions, including Classroom instruction on first aid principles, common medical emergencies, and response techniques, Hands-on practice of first aid skills, such as CPR, bleeding control, and splinting Scenario-based training to simulate real-life emergency situations.

As a result, the First Aid Kit Training program proved to be highly successful, with 70% of participants reporting a significant increase in their knowledge and confidence in providing first aid to others. The training led to noticeable improvements in response times and the overall effectiveness of handling emergency situations. It also contributed to reducing the risk of injury and illness both in the community and at the mica picking places.

I worked as a mica picker, which is risky and poorly paid. The four-wheeler cart from Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad has given me a new source of income. I now do both mica work and sell food items, which helps me support my family better.

From Mines to Market: Lakhan's Journey to Self-Reliance



Lakhan Ravidas (53), from Lalilewar village in Sono block, Jamui district, has spent over 35 years working in mica scrap collection, a physically demanding and risky job that pays very little. Despite owning some farmland, lack of irrigation in the hilly area limits agricultural income. Lakhan, his wife, and two children struggled to meet basic needs, surviving on about INR 3000 per month from mica work.

As age and health made mica collection even harder, Lakhan wanted to start a small business selling packed food at the busy auto stand. But he lacked capital to buy the four-wheeler cart he needed to transport goods and set up his stall. Lakhan approached the local Village Development Committee (VDC) formed under Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad's Community Empowerment Program. After assessing his plan and need, the VDC recommended his case. In March 2024, through the program's Asset Support Activity, Lakhan received a four-wheeler cart. He invested INR 3000 to buy stock and launched his stall at the tempo stand.

Initially, sales were low. Disappointed, Lakhan reported this to the project team. They advised him to be patient, consistent, and responsive to customer preferences, while keeping careful records and avoiding sales on credit. The team also visited regularly to support and motivate him.

By following this guidance, Lakhan steadily grew his customer base. Within two months, he reported earning about INR 2000 per month from his stall—an important supplement to his mica income. This diversification improved his family's financial security.

I am truly grateful for BJUP's support. They didn't just help me with my studies; they saved me from my own darkness. I now understand how much impact timely help, care, and education can have on someone's life. And I will always be thankful for that.

A Ray of Hope for Himanshu Kumar



In the quiet lanes of Kurkuri village, lives a young boy named Himanshu Kumar, whose journey from despair to determination is both heart-wrenching and inspiring. Four years ago, Himanshu lost his mother, Late Manmati Devi, to a prolonged illness is a devastating event that deeply impacted his mental health. Struggling with depression and loneliness, he abandoned his studies and fell into a spiral of hopelessness. Thoughts of self-harm haunted him frequently, and life seemed directionless.

It was during the implementation of Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad's (BJUP) field project in Paliganj block that the organization's team came across Himanshu. Recognizing the signs of emotional distress, Mr. Lakhan Mukhiya, a dedicated BJUP field worker, began regular visits and counselling sessions with Himanshu. These interactions slowly helped rebuild the trust and confidence the boy had lost.

Encouraged by the consistent support and motivation from BJUP, Himanshu found the courage to restart his academic journey. This year, he successfully passed the 10th grade from the CBSE board, securing second division (Marks: 272)—a milestone that once seemed impossible to him.

Currently, Himanshu is enrolled in a Diploma in Computer Application (DCA) course in Paliganj, taking one more step toward fulfilling his dream of becoming an engineer. His father, Jitendra Kumar Yadav, now stands firmly by his side, committed to supporting his son's aspirations.

Through this initiative, I have gained financial independence and confidence. I am now able to contribute to my family's income and make important decisions for our future.

Happy Covers: Stitching a New Future for Women of Shahpur Village



A group of 20 determined women from Shahpur village is stitching a new future for themselves through the Khushi Chadar Nirman enterprise, a bedsheet manufacturing unit established under the Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP), a collaborative initiative by Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP) and HDFC Bank Parivartan.

this enterprise began with a comprehensive three-month training program initiated in September 2023, equipping these women with the necessary skills for producing high-quality bedsheets branded as 'Happy Covers'. An initial raw material investment supported the production of 292 bedsheets to date, averaging 98 bedsheets per month.

Each bedsheet is produced at a cost of Rs. 200, covering fabric, transportation, rent, electricity, and stitching. Selling at Rs. 250 per piece, the enterprise enjoys a profit margin of Rs. 50 per bedsheet is already receiving orders from multiple sellers, signalling promising growth and a positive impact on the local economy. Through this initiative, women experience not only economic stability but also enhanced social empowerment. The cooperative model facilitates direct market access, linking women with buyers and suppliers while ensuring financial inclusion through connections with HDFC Bank. This has enabled participants to engage more actively in household and community decisions, boosting their confidence and social standing.

The Khushi Chadar Nirman enterprise exemplifies how skill-building, cooperative formation, and sustainable business models can transform rural livelihoods, creating pathways for women to break societal barriers and contribute meaningfully to their communities.

I am really grateful to BJUP for organizing this training. Before the session, I have learned that it is normal for my body to change and that I can talk about these things openly. I now know how to take care of myself, and I feel more confident about growing older. I hope other girls in my community also get this opportunity to learn about their bodies and health.

Empowering adolescents through SRHR education - The Story of Janvi Kumari



Janvi Kumari, a 13-year-old student from Dumarkol, a remote panchayat in Dhamani, Rajauli, lives 14 km away from the block office. She is currently in Class 6 at UMS Kumbharua and is one of four siblings in her family. Like many children her age, Janvi began noticing changes in her body as she approached puberty. However, she lacked the knowledge and understanding about these changes, feeling shy and embarrassed to ask anyone for help.

As Janvi navigated the challenges of growing up, she felt confused and uncertain about the physical changes happening to her body. Although she understood that these changes were a natural part of growing up, she still felt discomfort in asking questions or seeking advice from adults, leaving her with unanswered concerns.

Janvi's life began to change when she attended a training session on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), organized by Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad (BJUP) as part of the TFAT project. The training, designed to empower children and adolescents, especially girls, provided them with a safe space to discuss and understand the changes they were going through. Initially hesitant, Janvi soon realized that the program was exactly what she needed to gain clarity about her body and the physical transformations she was experiencing.

During the SRHR training, Janvi learned that the changes her body was undergoing were a natural part of puberty. The session explained the various stages of development and provided a non-judgmental space where she could ask questions without feeling embarrassed. But now, she feels more confident in her body and empowered with the information she needs to take care of her health. The training also encouraged her to approach trusted adults when she had questions, knowing that such conversations were important for her well-being.

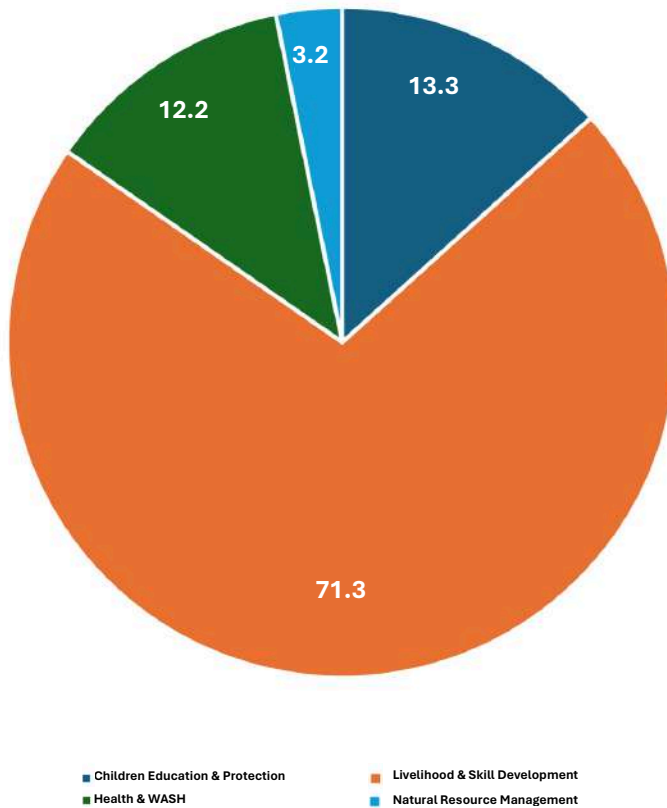

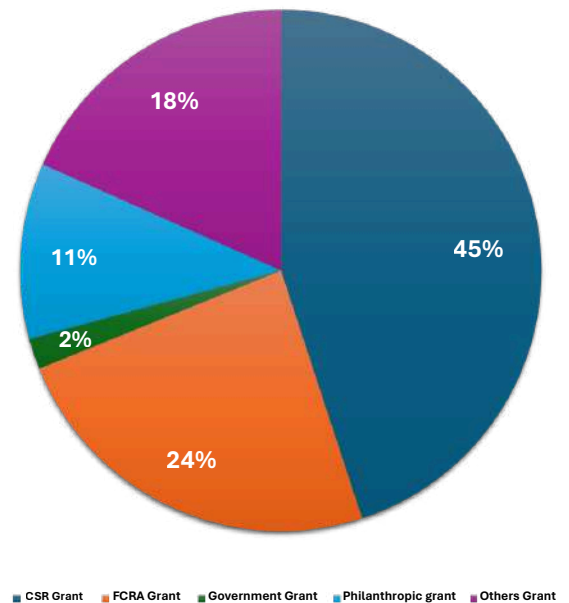

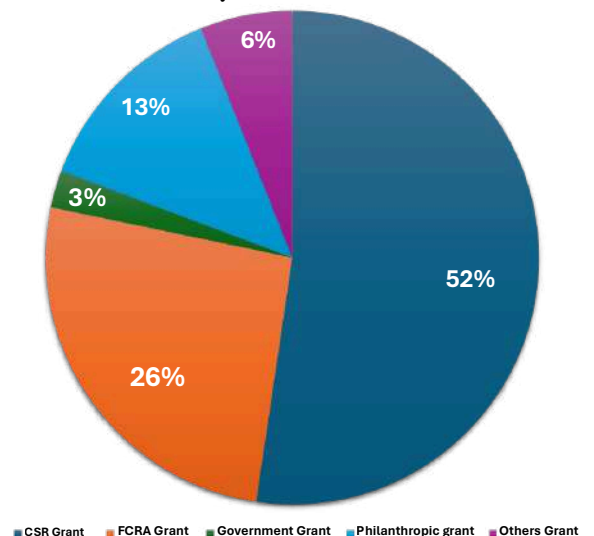
Component Wise Expenditure
